Mentioned speaking with the Construction Official who attended a meeting on the pump station they want to put in Little Ferry, and he would like to speak

to the Mayor of Little Ferry about the water flow from there. Also mentioned that Rebuild By Design wants to put a pump station in Carlstadt that will benefit Moonachie and take water from the airport and Moonachie Avenue, but the Moonachie has to maintain the station. Discussed the Rebuild by Design project in the area.

6. Ordinance for "Access Restrictions to Designated Municipal Facilities and Offices to protect and safeguard Public Records containing Personally Identifiable information".

Borough Clerk mentioned that the Police Chief is reviewing the Ordinance.

7. Moonachie School's Trees.

Mayor Vaccaro spoke about the trees at the school near the playground behind Mulvaney's property between the fenc, e on the tax map it is Borough property. Suggested that the Borough will share the cost with the school.
