INTRODUCTION OF MUNICIPAL BUDGET:

Administrator Ciannamea– mentioned that there is no tax increase this year and the tax rate is going down two and half cents per hundred. He spoke about assessed values, which went up about \$70,000,000, it went up on the commercial side than the residential side. He mentioned that average house in 2018 was \$337,600 and in 2019 the average house is \$345,100, the tax impact on average house is going down \$2.00. Also, he mentioned that the assessor bumped the assess values 15 to 20 percent on commercial side, he said that in other properties in Southern Bergen County towns are going up by 30%. He explained that the Borough benefited from the industrial side and spending went up with no tax increase. He mentioned that the Capital Fund is increased by \$340,000 and this budget has \$500,000 for capital improvement in case the Municipal building needs more money. He mentioned that taxes could have decrease 2% but next year it could go up 18% and the Borough took advantage to take long term responsible approach. Mayor Vaccaro- mentioned that the Borough is putting money aside to accomplish some of the thing in town without raising taxes.

Administrator Ciannamea- mentioned that there is half a million dollars in reserve for terminal packages for retirement and some town has to borrow money for retirement.
