ORDINANCE#2020-2 CALENDAR YEAR 2020 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

June 25, 2020

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Moonachie in the County of Bergen finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2020 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that a 1% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$78,650 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Mayor and Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Moonachie, in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2020 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Moonachie shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 1%, amounting to \$78,650, and that the CY 2020 municipal budget for the Borough of Moonachie be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

The Borough Clerk has presented an affidavit showing that advertisement had been made according to law.

Administrator Ciannamea spoke about the cap limit being 2.5% and this Ordinance allows 3.5% limit, but the Borough usually does not reach to 2.5%. He mentioned that the Ordinance allows to bank anything between 3.5% and what is actually spent, and can be used for two years if the Borough needs it.

> ORDINANCE #2020-3 AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MOONACHIE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 2019-9 OF THE BOROUGH FINALLY ADOPTED ON JANUARY 5, 2020, PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS IN AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF MOONACHIE AND APPROPRIATING \$758,100 THEREFOR, AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE

June 25, 2020

OF \$583,495 IN BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH OF MOONACHIE TO FINANCE THE SAME

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MOONACHIE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY (not less than twothirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Bond Ordinance Number 2019-9 of the Borough of Moonachie, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, finally adopted on January 5, 2020 (the "Prior Ordinance"), is hereby amended in full to read as follows:

The several improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of Section 1. this bond ordinance are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Moonachie, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough"), as general improvements. For the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriations made for each improvement or purpose, such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$758,100 (representing an increase of \$156,500 from the Prior Ordinance), including a \$14,565 grant from the 2016 Bergen County Open Space Trust Fund for the purpose set forth in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance, a \$17,603 grant from the 2017 Bergen County Open Space Trust Fund for the purpose set forth in Section 3(b) of this bond ordinance, a \$9,000 grant from the 2018 Bergen County Open Space Trust Fund for the purpose set forth in Section 3(c) of this bond ordinance, a \$47,500 Community Development Block Grant from the County of Bergen pursuant to a Contract dated as of July 1, 2019 for the purpose set forth in Section 3(d) of this bond ordinance, and a \$217,000 New Jersey Department of Transportation Fiscal Year 2019 Municipal Aid Program grant funded by the Transportation Trust Fund Authority Act, a \$195,000 (representing an increase of \$195,000 from the Prior Ordinance) New Jersey Department of Transportation Fiscal Year 2020 Municipal Aid Program grant funded by the Transportation Trust Fund Authority Act and \$156,500 from the Borough's Capital Improvement Fund appropriated for the purpose set forth in Section 3(g) of this bond ordinance, and the aggregate sum of \$18,105 as the several down payments for the improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law. The down payments have been made available by virtue of the provision in the capital improvement fund in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the several improvements or purposes not covered by application of the several down payments or otherwise provided for hereunder, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$583,495 (representing no increase from the Prior Ordinance) pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The several improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for which the bonds or notes are to be issued, the estimated cost of each improvement and the appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or

notes to be issued for each improvement and the period of usefulness of each improvement are as follows:

(1) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the several improvements or purposes is as stated in Section 2 hereof.

(m) The estimated cost of the several improvements or purposes is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such Section 4. times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget (or temporary capital budget, as applicable) of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget (or amended temporary capital budget, as applicable) and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The several improvements or purposes described in Section 3
 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the
 Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the costs
 thereof have been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of the several improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, computed on the basis of the respective amounts or obligations authorized for each improvement or purpose and the reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 10.47 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$583,495 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$159,400 (representing an increase of \$29,400 from the Prior Ordinance) for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the several improvements or purposes.

(e) The Borough reasonably expects to commence the acquisition and/or construction of the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the Borough further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof.

Section 7. Any grant moneys received for the purposes described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough is hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its

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undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. This Ordinance amends Bond Ordinance 2019-9 of the Borough finally adopted January 5, 2020. To the extent that the Prior Ordinance or any other previous ordinance or resolution is inconsistent herewith or contradictory hereto, said ordinance or resolution is hereby repealed or amended to the extent necessary to make it consistent herewith.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

The Borough Clerk has presented an affidavit showing that advertisement had been made according to law.

Administrator Ciannamea spoke about that the Ordinance moves funds from the Joseph Street Park to the East Joseph Street Park, and also increases money for the Road Program to include Section 5 of West Commercial Avenue.

P. Lerch- spoke about the Division of Local Government reviewing the budget and getting their approval. Mentioned that there is a 0% tax increase on residential units, the spending is going up 2.2%, there is a 5.4 surplus at the end of the year, the Borough has a healthy cash reserve. Mentioned that the rolling assessment contract is going well for the Borough, and have been aggressively paying notes more than the minimum. The reserve for tax appeals is over \$2.3 million. Spoke about in 2019 the remaining balance on the CDL for \$189,000, which was paid, and the budget is well below the cap. Spoke about impacts of COVID-19 were taken into account when creating the budget.

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Mayor Vaccaro thanked Mr. Lerch and his firm who worked on the budget. Thanked the governing body for their work and mentioned that the rolling reassessment benefitted the Borough. Spoke about watching spending, and wisely using taxpayer monies. Commended everyone for working together to get a budget with a 0% tax increase on the Municipal side for the second year in a row. PUBLIC HEARING ON THE BUDGET:
